

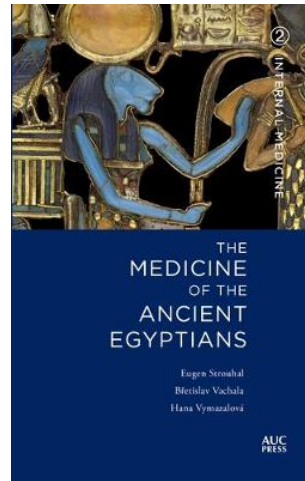

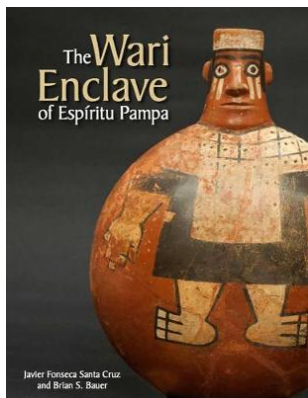

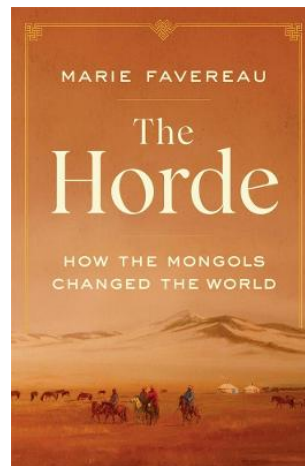
The Wari Enclave of Espiritu Pampa

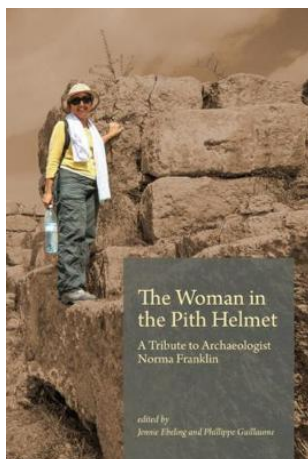

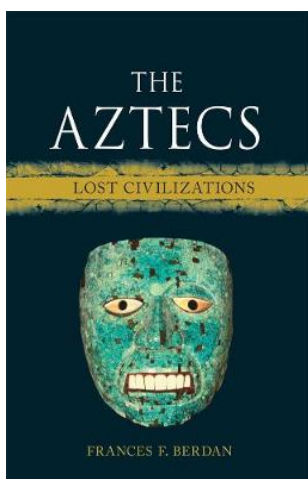

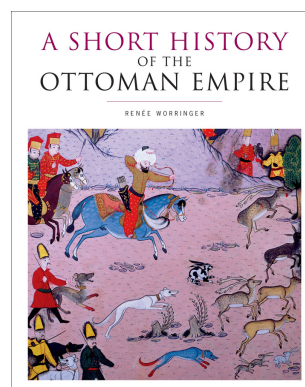
