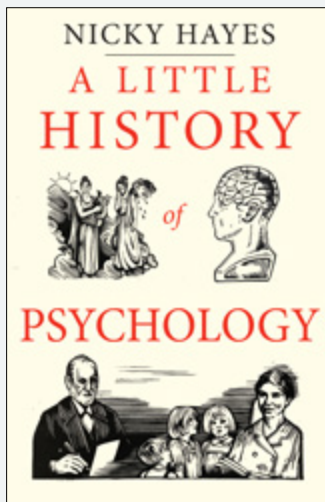

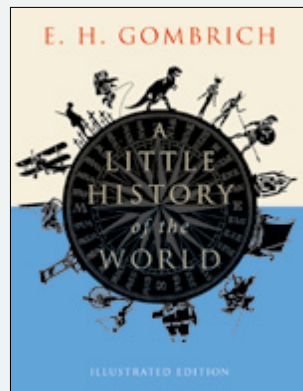
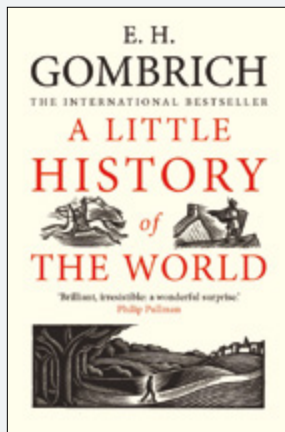
In this lively guide to the history of the human mind, Nicky Hayes explores how key thinkers and concepts have evolved the study of psychology over the centuries and around the world.
