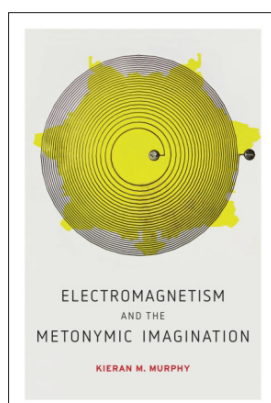


The Rohonc Code

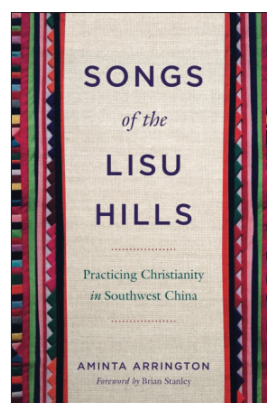


Electromagnetism and the Metonymic Imagination

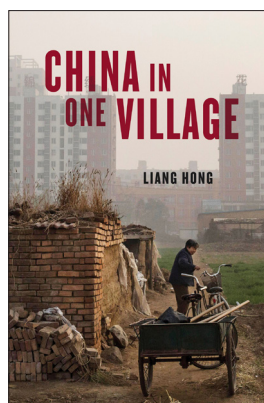
