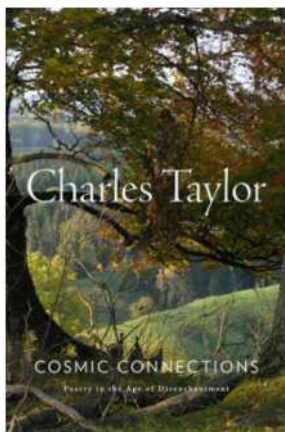

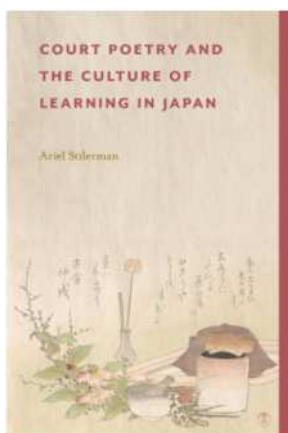

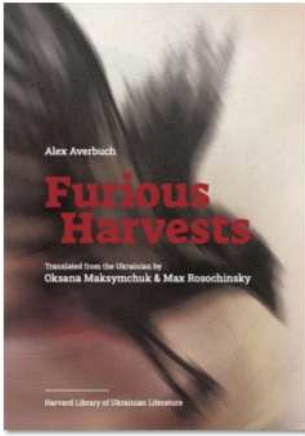
Court Poetry and the Culture of Learning in Japan

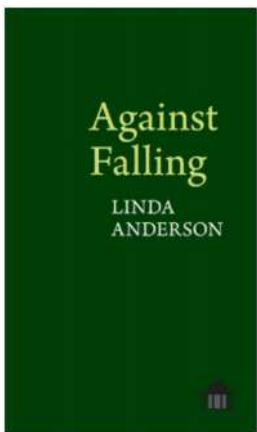
This Longing City : Modern Hebrew Poems of Jerusalem

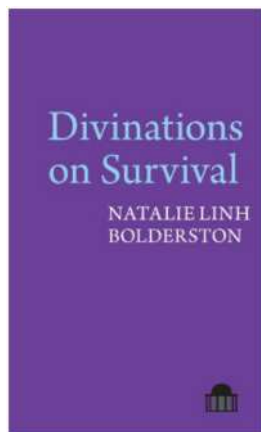

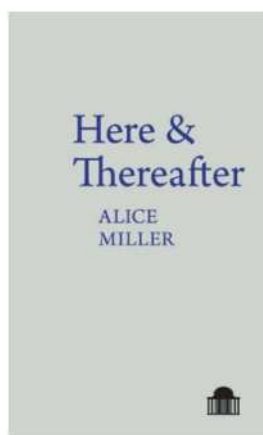
Divinations on Survival

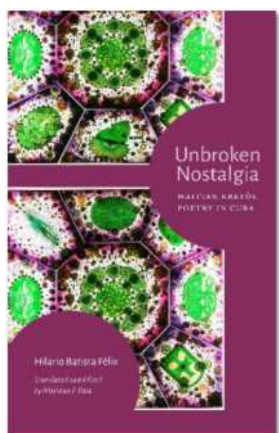
